When Jesus utters the words to love those who persecute you, in the sixth chapter of Luke the text leaves us no wiggle room. He demands that we be bearers of the grace we have received from him through our faith in him.

Despite our sin the scripture teaches us of a loving God that loves us unconditionally. The unconditional love, forgiveness, and redemption that Jesus shows to us, and then demands of us, is central to the faith. It helps us to grow in our relationship to God and in our relationship to others. It transforms us just as it did Peter when in the scripture Jesus gives him an opportunity to declare his love three times in order to offer redemption for a three-time denial. As a result, he was empowered to feed and tend the flock of the shepherd.

Having a heart that knows how to forgive helps us to more clearly see the risen Christ at work as when he commissions us as he did Peter to follow him. To be able to forgive in love & not dwell on feelings of hurt or anger, or revulsion, or pride does bring a reward. That reward is joy pure unadulterated honest joy. For when we can love somebody through, not despite, but through the enmity that they have caused us we truly begin to love them as God loves us.

The joy in loving one's enemy, the joy of forgiving those who have persecuted you, is in part the joy of our own relationship with the divine. In the merciful acts that we do for others we begin to emulate what God has so mercifully done for us.

That very moment when reached down and placed within you a peace and a joy that nobody can ever take away is your gift from God. It is this joy we celebrate, when we unselfishly love and forgive others.

# Moments in Time

As we move forward with our 250<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Bethel Presbyterian Church, this is the **March** installment of our ***Trip Down Memory Lane***. Enjoy your walk back in time.

## Bethel Presbyterian Church — 1821-1840

In 1823 the then current pastor, George Luckey, died, having served Bethel for 39 years, the longest in our history. He was buried in the cemetery. Tradition says that his grave is under the spot where stood the pulpit of the 1<sup>st</sup> church building.

In 1824 the 3<sup>rd</sup> pastor, George Morrison, arrived. At the age of only 15 he joined with a cavalry company to fight in the war of 1812. After this he studied theology and was licensed by the New Castle Presbytery in 1823. He lived on his farm in Sweet Air, Baltimore Co, and served Bethel only half time while also being principle of the Bel Air Academy, known as a "classical" school. He was also a skilled farmer who introduced the use of lime on farm fields. This was regarded as a waste of money for which he was ridiculed, some saying that giving money for lime was the the same as giving money to the Devil. However, when his fields became highly productive others started using it. Presumably, higher production also meant more giving to the church. His death at age 40 was the result of having been shot at the Academy by a "vicious youth". The pistol ball remained in his body for 11 years after which infection and severe pain set in. He is quoted as saying, "How trifling compared to the sufferings of Christ". In his final hours he sent a message to Bethel, "Tell them I am a man who has seen affliction".

Rev. Andrew Cross came to Bethel in 1837, staying until 1844. He writes in his history of Bethel that the use of "tokens" was still in place, these being small round pieces of lead given to members at the preparatory service on the Saturday before communion. He also says there was an old pulpit stand in the woods which was used for outdoor communion when the crowd was too large for the building. He says 'the old barrel pulpit, with an oaken frame hung to the ceiling as a sounding board, as useless as a log of wood, and heavy enough to have killed the preacher if it fell on him, was still there". After leaving, he still maintained close contact with his former congregation and it is said that he preached, at least once, in our present building, it having been built the year before he died. In a letter to a Bethel member in 1885 the writer says of Mr. Cross, "he has so many good and noble qualities I can overlook his peculiarities"

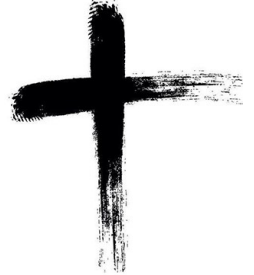
