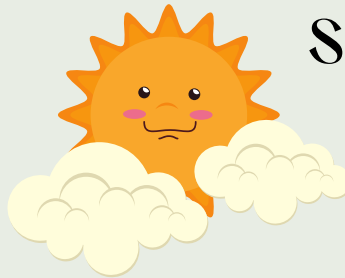

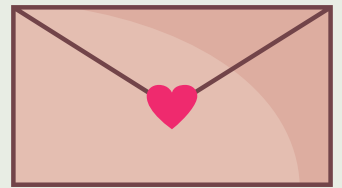

Lisa joined the staff of Bethel in November in 2020 and has really enjoyed getting to know the church and its members! She loves the peaceful setting and the warm, kind and thoughtful people she's met. Lisa lives in Bel Air with her husband, Charlie, and their 3 cats. Son Charlie, 23, works for an environmental engineering firm doing surveying and CAD design. Son Henry, 21, is stationed in Houston with the Coast Guard.

Lisa loves being outdoors and has recently started training to become a nature therapy guide for a local non-profit organization called Nature Worx. The program invites people to experience nature using mindfulness activities, and currently focuses on helping people who are dealing with addiction or other difficult life circumstances.

Lisa is also passionate about helping people discover different tools they can use to improve their mental health. She recently led a journaling workshop and shared how she has used journaling to deal with physical pain and create space for healing.

Lisa's love of travel began after her first trip to Germany upon graduating from Towson University in 1991. She spent 2 years in Japan teaching English and loved everything about it, especially the amazing food, skiing, and natural hot springs! She has visited 18 countries over the years, and it's hard to pick a favorite but she would probably say Australia, Thailand, Italy, Portugal, and Costa Rica were the top contenders! She dreams of someday walking the Camino de Santiago in Spain. In the meantime, she and her husband hope to celebrate their 25th anniversary this year with a trip to Oregon for some hiking and sightseeing!

You may be interested to learn that Lisa recently completed something called the "100 Day Dress Challenge," in which she chose to wear the same merino wool dress for 100 days in a row. (If you visited the office anytime in past few months, you would have seen the dress. It's also in the photo above. She even wore it under her costume for the Cemetery Players skit!) Lisa had several reasons for doing this challenge: as a distraction from Covid, to support the environment by choosing sustainable fashion over fast fashion, and as inspiration to pare down her closet and eliminate "decision fatigue" when deciding what to wear. She had fun creating different looks for each day and definitely learned that less is more! Thank you to Chad Rogers for holding a beautiful recital! About 40 people enjoyed his moving performance. We welcome him back anytime!



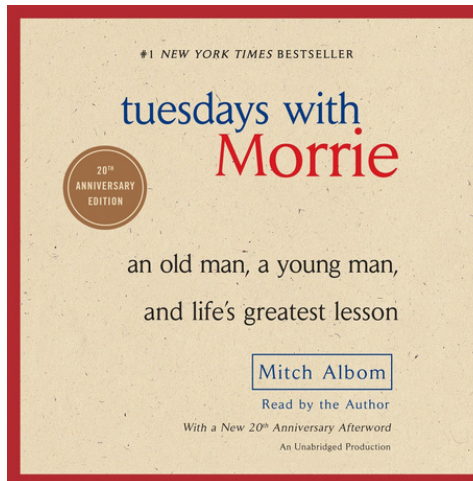
Pause for Poetry
