The Pastor's Corner

Did you know that the Easter season lasts all the way until Pentecost, which this year is the last Sunday in May? As we reflect on the Easter message, it is a time for us to look at Jesus as a living vital part of our lives. The risen Christ is not dead but is alive and he knows you, loves you, and longs to be in relationship to you just as deeply as he did the disciples. The Christ who knows us knows our deepest personal anguish, our greatest personal joys, and our deepest personal thoughts.

The Christ who knows us understands humanity from the moment of birth to the moment of death. The Christ who knows us offers us the life-giving power of God. The Christ who knows us offers us a future full of promise and possibility. Easter is a call not only to celebrate the good news, but to now be the good news.

We are called to receive mercy, and to give it in return. We are called to accept forgiveness, and to forgive. We are called to be loved, and to love one another unconditionally. We are called to be reconciled to God and to reconcile with others. Through Christ we are accepted by God, and we are called to accept others.

The Christ who knows us, knows us intimately, so intimately that we indeed may try to run and hide from God. But just like Peter in the final chapter of John's Gospel, God will find us, forgive us, and call us to serve. Through Jesus Christ, God refuses to give up or call it quits regarding his children even when we do. In the Easter season, we are called to live every moment with all the joy, commitment, courage, hope, faith, love, praise, and enthusiasm we can summon and display.

Remember the promise: The promise of Easter. Jesus says, "I am the resurrection and the life. Believe in me, hang on to me, and you will never die. From birth to death, I will never leave you amid life's anguish, which sometimes causes us to believe that there are parts of us that have died. I will also be there for you when the joys of life reign upon you and you are filled with hope. I am with you always."

God's presence is constant, and his promise is sure: We, too, will one day rise and live, laugh and love in the presence of God eternally. Remember that promise! He is alive! He is Risen! He is Risen indeed!

Easy Oreo Truffles

Ingredients

- 1 (16 ounce) package OREO Chocolate Sandwich Cookies, divided
- 1 (8 ounce) package PHILADELPHIA Cream Cheese, softened
- 2 (8 ounce) packages BAKER'S Semi-Sweet Baking Chocolate, melted



Directions (makes about 42 truffles)

Crush 9 of the cookies to fine crumbs in food processor; reserve for later use. (Cookies can also be finely crushed in a resealable plastic bag using a rolling pin.) Crush remaining 36 cookies to fine crumbs; place in medium bowl. Add cream cheese; mix until well blended. Roll cookie mixture into 42 balls, about 1 inch in diameter.

Dip balls in chocolate; place on wax paper-covered baking sheet. Sprinkle with reserved cookie crumbs. **Tips** for dipping truffles: Place truffle ball in melted chocolate to coat. Lift truffle from chocolate using 2 forks, allowing excess chocolate to run off before placing on wax paper. Refrigerate until firm, about 1 hour. Store leftover truffles, covered, in refrigerator.
